Reported Pattern: Voice-Based Psychological Disabling and Decision Interference

When alleged criminal users of advanced weapons technology direct external voices or sounds into a victim's head or personal space on a continuous basis, victims report that it can psychologically disable, confuse, and distract them from using their own problem-solving skills.

Victims describe this as a 24/7 bombardment of noise, voices, commands, threats, pressure, or manipulation. Over time, this reported constant interference may prevent the victim from thinking clearly, making independent decisions, or figuring out how to help themselves.

After months or years of being exposed to repeated external voices or sound-based harassment, some victims report that they no longer know the difference between their own inner voice and the alleged weapons-based voice being directed at them. This can create serious confusion, fear, dependency, and loss of personal autonomy.

Victims further report feeling pressured or forced against their will to obey what they describe as a remotely connected inner voice. This voice may tell them what to do, what to say, who to trust, who to avoid, where to go, what decisions to make, or how to behave in different areas of their lives.

From a DEW Police crime-analysis perspective, this reported pattern may represent psychological coercion, acoustic harassment, remote manipulation, and interference with free will, decision-making, and personal safety.
